

In 2021 when John and Tricia Shriver first came to Surrey Hills, the first person they met was Vic Smith, who was head of the safety and greeting team at that time and John told him he would like to help. Almost four years later, John has established a comprehensive Safety Team Ministry system which reflects order and planning on his part. John and Tricia have a small business, Eyes & Ears Gun Training, in which they train individuals on Concealed Carry and Home Defense to obtain their Oklahoma CCW license. They have trained at least six men and women in the church family. On any Sunday morning as many as 8 men and women are in position to handle conflicts should they arise. Any safety team member who carries a concealed weapon is required to have a CCW permit. John has implemented an intense and ongoing training program in conjunction with Sheepdog Church Security, a training organization based in Minnesota, to ensure that team members are well equipped for various situations. The Sheepdog Church Security training includes Security Team Fundamentals, Active Assailant, De-escalating Disruptive Persons, Protecting Children from Abuse, Basic Use of Force Law, Arson and Fire Safety, Storms and Disasters, and Mass Trauma. PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

On January 1, 1802, President Thomas Jefferson, soon to be inaugurated, wrote a now famous and infamous letter to the Danbury **Baptist Association. Jefferson was responding** to a letter sent to him by the church in Danbury, CT. The letter celebrated the election and pointed to God's ordination of Jefferson as soon to be president. The letter also highlighted Jefferson's already long service in the new nation. The letter's core was to seek Jeffersonon's position on the freedom of religion under his new administration. In response, and what has been cussed and discussed, Jefferson highlighted the First Amendment's protection of religious liberty, stating that it created "a wall of separation between Church & State." I call this famous and infamous because no matter your position on religion in the United States, this line is both encouraging and discouraging. Both sides of the spectrum want more and less to be said about this issue.

As we step into 2025, 223 years separated from Jefferson's letter, let's celebrate that we still have freedom of religion in the United States! Much good has been done in Jesus' name in the United States, and we should praise Him for that work. We give thanks for God's blessings on His church. While we are tempted to look back and see how things were, let's expect that God still has plans for us and new opportunities lie ahead. ...and volunteers have participated in the Protecting Children from Abuse and some medical training. This next year John and Don Willock plan for more training and education for team members. Depending on funding, the team hopes to improve our camera system, alarm system and overall facility security. "When I first came here it took me more than six months to identify what the building layout was, and it is an ongoing process to know how to protect a facility with 18 entrances" John said. Team members like Ray Kitko do routine checks on the emergency lighting, fire extinguishers, AED's and he monitors the Kingsgate entrance most weekends. The Safety Team tries to monitor all events held at the church. During Vacation Bible School last summer, the Safety Team was able to locate and reunite a lost child with the parents. Most Sundays you will find Angel Lledo patrolling the parking lot. Sanctuary and Foyer safety is covered by Jason Austin, John Williamson, Kevin Pond, Greg Peters, Brandon McDonald, Stephen Graham, Don Willock and John Shriver. Vic Smith, Mark Hoffman and Ken Kamphaus are assigned to watch the monitor connected to the exterior and interior cameras on Sunday mornings while greeters Bob Regnier, Jerri Conine and Tricia Shriver know to watch for any unusual behavior. Wednesday evening activities are monitored by Don Willock, Stephen Graham, Greg Peters, Brandon McDonald and John Shriver. Youth activities are monitored by Courtney Keck. Firearm training is being spearheaded now by Don Willock and Steve Graham. Medical safety will be coordinated by Mark Hoffman, Jesse Blouin and Dan Harris. People involved on the safety team usually wear Safety Team badges and everyone is encouraged to get to know the team members. "If you see something out of the ordinary, Tell a Safety Team Member". "The safety team will continue to train and address any emergency," said John, "including Fire Evacuation and Tornado Safety, CPR, STOP THE BLEED, AED training, Protecting Children from Abuse within the Youth, Children and Nursery Ministries and intruders into the church." The Surrey Hills Baptist Church community can rest assured that they are being protected while on campus by a dedicated Safety Team Ministry.

He was a large man, not obese, just tall and a man who would "fill the doorway" as my husband says. I remember him fondly; my husband remembers him as a hardworking, and faithful family man. My husband remembers when he was young an incident that affected his father greatly. The family was traveling and was involved in a head-on collision. RESOLUTIONS FOR LIFE

In 1636 the Puritans founded Harvard, the first college in America. It had one degree program - Ministry. If you attended most of the colleges in those days you were training for one profession - ministry, and used one textbook, the Bible. Today the Bible is howled off the Harvard campus, scorned as a joke for weak and narrow minds, instead of being hailed as the ultimate source of truth.

In 1716 Jonathan Edwards, one of America's great theologians, headed to Yale College at the age of 13. (Thirteen? Was he a child genius? Well, yes. But there were no high schools then so a young man's choices were a trade or college.) Assessing how he wished to live his life (at 13!) he produced a list of "resolves" - what we call resolutions. (Recall what you were doing at age 13. I was shooting hoops in the backyard, wondering what was for supper. I wasn't making a list like the following:)

A Young Puritan's Code

Resolved, (means "decided" - a form of "resolution") to live with all my might while I do live Resolved, never to do anything which I should be afraid to do if it were the last hour of my life Resolved, never to do anything out of revenge

Resolved, ...to improve...(myself) in the most profitable way I possilbly can Resolved, to study the scriptures...constantly, steadily, frequently Resolved, to maintain the strictest temerance in eating and drinking

Resolved, never to suffer the least motions of anger to irrational beings (one of my faves - any irrational beings on the road these days? Pulling into the lane ahead of you? Oblivious to their turn signal? Going 20 miles below the speed limit? "You irrational being," I mutter. Jonathan would be proud).

Resolved, after afflictions, to inquire what I am better for them; what good have I got, and what might I have got by them (Afflictions? My response is usually "Why did this happen to me?")

(Wow. There are 14 of these.) Note the word "Puritan" in the title. These days it is linked mostly with being narrow or closed minded. "Don't be so "puritanical." (Honestly, I don't see anything here I disagree with, do you?) Written over 300 years ago, Jonathan's words still offer good advise. (This list was in the first textbook I used in English class in 1977, and not in any edition since. If you are a young person reading this, I challenge you to come up with your own code. What are a few principles you would choose for life?)
