We've provided meals, gift cards for gasoline, medication, educational opportunities, school fees, just to mention a few. We want each member to know that they are loved and cared for. They do not stand alone. We can't always 'fix' the problem...but we can 'do something'.

Our second goal is to encourage and celebrate our members. We do this in small ways like: sending a card to members who are sick, been absent for a while or just joined (aka new members). Send thank you cards to members to show appreciation for a job well done or to thank others for their continual, faithful service to our church. Right now we are also sending monthly notes and small gift cards to our High School Seniors to encourage them.

In short, the HE Ministry strives to lovingly care for our membership. We meet once a month and pray for our church, and members' needs. Please note: we strive to maintain privacy and confidentiality in all we do.

"Compliments to the chef!" are certainly in order when Nancy Kitko is doing the food preparation and she does that every Wednesday night at SH. For about two years now Nancy has worn the apron and put on the meals for the midweek dinner time providing not only good food but a chance for fellowship in the congregation. She is aided by a small but faithful staff including Tricia Shriver, Donna Kaye Brady and Nancy Bird and "pretty much the whole fellowship committee I can call on for help."

"I love to cook!" she exclaims with a smile. And she loves serving the congregation with her talents. Besides the Wednesday night meal she caters breakfasts and refreshments for several groups in the church. Cooking became

her second full time occupation. After spending 25 years in the medical field Nancy decided to give catering a try in 1995 and found her love for cooking. "I was raising my three kids and could be home with them" she said. When she was told she couldn't fix catered food from her own kitchen she opened a restaurant in 2000, Nancy's 57th Street Lighthouse. "My claim to fame is that all Americans could come. We didn't care about color or creed everyone was welcome if they would be nice to each other. A lot of people found peace and happiness in my place. It's the biggest success of my life." She retired from the restaurant three moths before covid hit.

What is her favorite dish to fix? "Having been in catering I have a weird answer for that question – I want to fix what you like best. My whole purpose for catering was to make people happy and bring them together – even at funerals.. I never did a sad event.

TEMPTATION TO DOUBT



We do have a SHBC connection with Jerri's mom, Sam in attendance. I did get some on the job training with my mother having dementia and alzheimers the last eight years of her life. We really try hard to make the Bible study on topics they are dealing with during this stage of their lives. We really try to ask questions to provoke their answers. We really need to expand our reach to the residents, for some need the gospel.
